My first National Convention was in Buffalo, New York in 1965. We had about 120 Jaycees from Massachusetts on the floor of the Convention Center with the women relegated to the balcony.

The voting for National President had gone on for hours. The politics said we should be voting for Doc Rainey from Kentucky who was running against Jim Skidmore from New Jersey.

The way the vote came about, Massachusetts was going to be the kingmaker to elect the next President of the US Jaycees.

We went outside to caucus and the vote was 51 for Rainey and 50 for Skidmore. We went back in with the horseshoe shaped signs for Rainey and the place erupted.

My good friend John Palzcinsky (recently deceased) said "Massachusetts passes". I asked him what was he thinking and he said "I didn't vote and I like Skidmore better". He wanted to go outside for caucus, but 10,000 delegates were blocking the way. I told him to do it right there, so he exercised his right to vote, which tied it and then cast his vote as Vice President. He was not a big man, so we surrounded him as he said loudly into the microphone, "Massachusetts is proud to cast its votes for our good neighbor from New Jersey Jim Skidmore".

The women in the balcony dropped the Rainey signs and quickly picked up Skidmore ones and the whole place was pure bedlam! When we went on the "Maid of the Mist", all I could hear above the sound of the falls was - "We want Skidmore". I'm sure it was due to no sleep and 24 hours of voting!

As we were driving home on the New York Thruway that day, half of the cars honked and gave us thumbs up and the other half gave us another sign.

It was a memorable way to start my Jaycee career.

The following is a summary from Douglas of the present status of the account:

In the eight years since July 01, 2003 when new investment guidelines were adopted, the total portfolio value has grown from \$385,580.00 by a net \$139,609.00 to the June 30, 2011 balance of \$525,189.00. This growth resulted from a cumulative investment return of \$228,609.00 additional new capital of \$51,000.00 less withdrawals of \$140,000.00 to fund JCI Canada activities.

We have been seen some very positive activity in JCI over this few past years and from the comments and increase in the number of new Chapters being formed we feel that the return of Investment money to them is starting to pay off.

I want to thank those Senators who are assisting in the support of these new Chapters and compliment Senator Rene Jacob 22847 on his "Return the Favour" campaign.

He has headed more of these election campaigns than any other living Canadian and it made for quite an hour.

Senator David Sopuch 63019 was elected President. He joined the Toronto unit in 1994, was VP of Corp. Sponsorship in 2000, President of the Board of Trade Young Professionals 2000-2001, became a Senator in 2002 and attended 7 JCI World Congresses. He operates a global e-commerce software company in 4 countries from Europe to China.

On March 7, our Luncheon Speaker will be Gordon Peck, Chairman of the Toronto Junior Board of Trade in 1955-1956. He has been called a Living Legend in the Retail Leasing world. After RC Naval service which included the D-Day invasion of Normandy, Gordon undertook the re-zoning, merchandising and leasing of 20 Shopping Centres across Canada including Sherway Gardens where he pioneered the first 'Food Court'. He was Canadian Chairman of the International Council of Shopping Centres from 1993-1996 and is widely known as the Dean of Retail Leasing in Canada. His experiences should be interesting.
